Rock Island churches will be holding Easter services tomorrow at the regular Easter services, which have been arranged as usual this year. The public always augments the usual church services on Easter Sunday, and the congregation enlarged as ever since the last year's services, all the auditoriums should be well filled.

Probably the only church in the world where Easter eggs are regularly given away to the worshippers is St. Mary Woolnoth in London. The ceremony has been observed at this church for nearly seven hundred years. For a long time the eggs were provided in accordance with the terms of a legacy left by a certain John Spones, but this legacy has lapsed long since, and the eggs have been supplied by the generosity of successive rectors. Every egg given away bears the words of the text from which the rector preaches on Easter Sunday. Many members of the congregation have preserved their eggs for many years, and possess a long record of the church's Easter texts.
