

BRING SUIT TO ENFORCE TERMS OF LAND SALE

Alleged That Bidders for Taze Farm in Henry County Are Trying to Retreat.

Arthur and George Johnson and Earl L. Stanley are defendants in action started today in circuit court to compel them to carry out alleged agreements to purchase portions of farm lands in Henry county, formerly owned by W. I. Taze of East Moline, which were offered and bid at a public sale.

It is charged in the bill on file with the circuit clerk that Bert Shearman and Tom Byers, who occupy the lands as tenants, refuse to give up possession. It is further alleged that the high bidders refused to take the lands subject to such tenancy. The bill claims that the bidders and the tenants are in cooperation to conceal the carrying out of the purchase, and that they are represented by the same attorneys.

Sale of lands, according to the bill on file, was brought about through the process of the settlement of the affairs of the Manufacturers' State bank of East Moline as they had been carried on by W. I. Taze, vice president and cashier of the institution.

It is alleged that in September, 1919, bank examiners for the state found a shortage of about \$150,000 in the bank's books, and further that an amount ranging from \$100,000 to \$150,000 of the bank's funds had been loaned without the authorization of the loan committee of the bank.

As a result of this investigation, State Auditor Andrew Russell placed the affairs of the bank in the hands of a committee consisting of F. H. Rallsback, E. H. Guyer, C. E. White, H. W. Horst and A. H. Wendt, and Taze turned over to this committee personal property of his to cover the amount of the shortages.

Part of the property consisted of 40 acres of Henry county farm land and public sale of this was ordered as a means of obtaining cash from the property. This land belonged to W. I. Taze, Anna M. Taze and Janella Taze.

LOUD CRIES OF "HELP" HEARD FROM BEE FARM

Warm Weather Brings Out Busy Little Workers and Police Are Asked to Quell Them.

The Rock Island police today are seriously puzzled over what steps are to be taken in regard to complaints of persons living in the east end bluff district, where a neighbor is keeping a number of hives of bees that are stirring around considerably now that the weather is warmer.

Commissioner William Fitzsimmons, in charge of the department of public health and safety, says the complaints are that the bees are stinging children and that neighbor women cannot hang clothes out in the yard on wash-day as the bees get too friendly.

The commissioner put the matter up to City Attorney J. K. Scott, who asserted that the city has no ordinance prohibiting the keeping of bees within the city limits. He said that a number of cities have such ordinances, and that if Rock Island was so provided the present situation would amount to no more than ordering the owner of the bees to remove them out of town. However, under the circumstances he advised that the matter be turned over to the police.

"Can you beat it?" members of the police force are asking. "We can't order those people to hustle those bees out of town because the ordinance doesn't cover the situation."

"Still, we are asked to settle the matter. We'll probably have to go up and disperse those bees. Perhaps we will have to 'planch' a few of them, or more likely get 'planch'ed ourselves by tangling up in the affairs of those little fellows."

"What is needed is the speed cop on the job. He could start something, and in case it was too much for him to finish, he could get away from the vicinity of those bees pretty quick."

"However, no motorcycle cop is on duty yet, and it will probably be up to just a plain 'harness cop' to get himself decorated with court plasters as the result of trying to do his duty."

However, the department heads have not decided yet just what to do in the matter. The individual officers, on the other hand, are making their decisions fast. Many have already made up their minds as to what they are going to do.
