Chicago Boy, Felled Three Times Before Counted Out, Loses Edge in Strategy.

Benton Harbor, Mich., July 6.—Benny Leonard, world champion of the lightweight division, knocked through the ropes of the arena in the fifth round by a left hook to the jaw, punished and beaten for eight rounds by Charley White, Chicago challenger, retained his title only through knock-out strategy yesterday afternoon. Leading White to open by a left jab to the clinch, Leonard, who surprised the fans as well as the champion by ruling the ring and defeating the New Yorker on points for eight rounds, lay limp on the canvas as the fatal tenth count proclaimed Leonard victor.

After the count, with horrible lack of control of his limbs, White struggled to his feet. Unable to stand he toppled over, his seconds carrying him from the ring. Before a monster crowd of 12,000 the champion and his challenger entered the ring. White, in a statement made before he crawled through the ropes to await the



opening gong, said that he would fight Leonard on his toes. And he did, carrying the battle to the champion in every round, even in the fatal ninth when his aggressiveness led him into the trap laid for him by the strategy of the Gotham boy. In brainwork alone Leonard had the edge.

Knocks Champion Down. In the fifth round, White took the fight out of the champion by a powerful left hook which knocked Leonard through the ropes. Lying helpless, the champion was unable to regain his feet without the assistance of his seconds, considered by some a ragged breach of the ethics of the ring game. For the next three rounds, even into the ninth, White set the pace and with a wonderful offensive, subjected the crown defender to a terrible punishing punishment.
