In speaking of the campaign Assistant Secretary Reitzler, stated that the question had been asked as to the necessity for such an organization in Rock Island, and in reply he said: "To be truly great a city must be a community of ideas. Where dwells the leadership in civic affairs? These are questions the answers to which reveal the character of a city. A properly organized Chamber of Commerce is the starting house for all activities which make a good city to live in."


