

### Should City Plan Include Benefit Rock Island Most? Send Suggestions to The Argus

Use of our water power for lighting, heating, cooking, power, and other uses, and for the use of the city in the future, is the main reason for the plan, and it is the duty of every citizen to express his views on this subject to the city planner.

The city would be much cleaner as it would do away with smoke. The gas consumed in the homes and in the street cars is the cause of many headaches. The lines could be stretched under ground instead of overhead and in that way avoid many dangers.

"As E. H. Gayer said several years ago, the city should have a municipal system for fruit and shade trees and property owners should be required to use it. They could pay by the year, amount used, or by the number of trees sprayed. This would save our fruits and as our population is growing, would mean an added food supply."

The idea of the municipal spraying plant would be to conserve the fruits and shade trees, as this part of the state is struck with worms and tussock moths which eat the trees. As it is the fruits are rotted by insects and trees are killed by the moths. As the population increases, Mrs. Foss says, there is more reason for conserving our trees and feed more people. Back yard fruit trees should be taken care of at the start.

A plant owned by the city could be used by property owners, who would pay either by the amount of the serum used, by the year, or by the number of trees sprayed. The spraying should be made compulsory.

The suggestion of planting nut trees along the boulevard to increase the production of fruits and also add to the beauty of the city, has been made before in The Argus. Mrs. Foss endorses the proposition and believes that the city planner should consider it in a plan for a future better Rock Island. Mrs. Foss' suggestions are:

"I think with Rock Island situated as ideally as it is, it should make use of its water power for all electricity, thereby making it cheaper, more accessible, save time and energy, mean a more sanitary city and home and be of convenience to the public. It would make life worth living for."

"I know that people believe the project too big for the city to handle because it will involve so much money. I grant that, but I am sure that after it is started and bonds are floated, as they were when our other water power houses were established, the city would be paying interest on the investments."

"There are several cities in Wisconsin and elsewhere where the plan is used successfully and I know it has and will work. I remember reading several years ago in the Independent where the American consul at Norway told how his monthly bill was only \$25 because water power was used there exclusively."


