**SHERRARD FAVORS RAISING MONEY TO ERECT NEW SCHOOL**

(Special to The Argus.) Sherrard, Oct. 15.—Voters of four school districts which comprise the Sherrard community district, are voting today upon a \$60,000 bond issue to provide funds for a new school building.

Indications were that there would be no great opposition to the proposal. School authorities and residents who have been supporting the bond issue plan propose immediate erection of a fireproof school building with modern equipment throughout. Preliminary sketches of the building have been submitted by Whitsitt & Schulake, Moline architects, and if bonds are voted specifications will be submitted to contractors without delay. Work will be rushed and the new building, it is hoped, will be ready for occupancy in the spring.


