

WINNING GRACE OF JESUS TOLD BY REV. HUGHES

Who saved Others, Himself He Cannot Save," Is Text of Sunday Sermon.

Drawing his word pictures from the scene of the sacrifice of the Christ on Calvary's summit and stressing the humility and lack of thought of self as he refused to use his own power to save himself and sacrifice the world, Rev. Thomas Hughes, pastor of the Cleveland Presbyterian church, developed into a powerful sermon the truth of Jesus' grace and power to save all.

Rev. Hughes took his text from Matthew 27:42: "He saved others; himself he cannot save," and said: "The world's greatest tragedy was drawing to a conclusion; the pursuit, noblest and most unselfish of men was paying the price of daring to think, teach and act in advance of the thought of his day.

"The conservatives hated him and the liberals were too cowardly to follow him, so he trod the wine press alone.

"Hell had momentarily triumphed. Truth was on the scaffold, wrong was on the throne. The Christ was hanging on the blood-crooked symbol of cruelty and shame, and gathered round him were his bitter enemies—not satisfied with having obtained the sentence of death on him, they must needs follow him up the Via Dolorosa to the place of execution; they wished to feast their fiendish eyes and satanic hearts upon the pain and agony of their innocent victim; to throw at his innocent flesh gibes and venomous taunts. With hearts dead to pity and all humane feelings, they made mockery of his seeming weakness, offering him their loyalty and service if he would step down from the cross, and saying in the words of the beast: 'He saves others; himself he cannot save.'

"He saved others."

"From this we get the strongest testimony as to the vindication of the claims of Christ and the prediction of prophets and angels concerning his mission.

"At the announcement to Mary concerning the child to be born of her, the angel declared: 'His name shall be Jesus for he shall save his people from their sins.' To the shepherds attending their flocks upon the hills of Bethlehem, the angels delivered this message: 'Unto you is born this day a SAVIOR, which is Christ the God.' Of himself Jesus said: 'The Son of Man is come to seek and to save that which is lost.' Here were predictions and claims that challenge the expectations of the world. Would they be realized?

Much Evidence.

"Would the hopes thus created be dashed to the ground? Would the

anticipations prove to be a mirage? Shall we seek for contemporary evidence of their fulfillment? Here is Matthew and the Samaritan woman. The men out of whom was cast the legion of devils, Peter, James and John; the woman caught in her crime, to whom he said, 'Neither do I condemn thee,' and the unnamed multitude included in the term.

"But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name," and a host of others that confirm the testimony of his enemies.

"He saved others."

"If others, then why not me? Why not you?" For he is no respecter of persons. "Him that cometh to Me, I will in no wise cast out."

"The taunt stresses his inability to save himself: 'Himself he cannot save.'

"This statement is primarily a taunt thrown into the face of the Son of God as he hung on the cross.

"It is aflame with the hate of hell. It is saturated with the spirit that gloats over the inability of a victor to deliver himself from the tortures inflicted upon him.

Uttered from Frank.

"But unknowingly the man who uttered these words, 'He saved others; himself he cannot save,' were

bringing utterance to a deep fundamental spiritual truth, that lies at the foundation of all spiritual advancement.

"Namely, that sacrifice is the price of redemption. There was a sense in which the saying, 'Himself he cannot save,' was not true. 'I lay down my life; no man taketh it from me.' The good shepherd layeth down his life for the sheep. 'Thinkest thou that I cannot pray to my Father and he shall presently give me more than 12 legions of angels?'

"His death was a voluntary one. He refused the help that was at his command for his deliverance.

But to be the Savior of mankind and at the same time save himself was a spiritual impossibility. To have saved himself would have robbed him of that title which has set his name above every name and have doomed the world to destruction.

Is True for All.

"What is true in Christ's case is true for us as individuals, as churches, as labor organizations or manufacturers, and as a nation. The divine plan of salvation for individuals or nations is that of sacrifice for others. 'He that loveth his life shall lose it; he that loseth his life for My sake shall find it.' This is the great argument made by the rejectors of the League of Nations—at least, that is what they pretend to see in it: that it involves sacrifices on the part of the nation.

"Maybe someone can devise a plan where we as a nation may become the savior of the world and eliminate this principle of sacrifice. But God could not."

"We must remember that the voice of the populace is not necessarily the voice of God. Of old it was the voice of the multitude that cried, 'Away with him; crucify him.'"
