HUSBAND MUST PAY \$12 EACH WEEK TO WIFE

Frank Hillar, a recent arrival in Rock Island, was arraigned before Judge H. A. Larson in county court this morning on a complaint of his wife, who charges him with failure to contribute to the support of her or her children. The court ordered him to pay \$12 weekly.

The young wife related a story of ill-treatment according to her and to her children, ages 6 and 4, dating back several years. At one time the couple resided in Davenport, but prior to coming to Rock Island had lived in Washington, Iowa. Mrs. Hillar claimed that she could afford no more clothing for herself or children than that on their backs. She said she left her Washington home about four months ago and took with her a small sum of money she had managed to save in order to come to her mother in Davenport. Later the husband came here at her request, but has persisted in withholding support to the family.
