At the Twelfth Annual Meeting of the Chicago League of Professional Baseball Players, held at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, Chicago, Dec. 6, the so-called insurrectionists still have full control of the league.

Champaign, Ill., Dec. 7.—Champaign high school claims the prep football championship of the state of Illinois this year. Elgin, who claims the championship, defeated East Aurora, 7-0, while Streator defeated East Aurora by a score of 7-7. Champaign, however, defeated Streator, 27 to 12.

Champaign high has the unique records of five years without a defeat. During the five years the local team has played 35 games, or an average of seven games per season. But one game of this number has been a tie game, that of the initial game of 1916 with Villa Grove, when each team annexed 7 points.

During the five years Champaign has scored 1,330 points, against 68 made by opponents. Twenty-seven games their opponents were unable to score against the local lads.

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THINK DECISION REAL VICTORY FOR BASEBALL

Supreme Court Reverses Judgment Favoring Baltimore Federal Leaguers.

Chicago, Dec. 7.—Organized baseball as a whole will welcome the decision of the United States supreme court in Washington yesterday in reversing the recent judgment for \$264,000 against Major League clubs, according to magazine here today. The original decision awarded the Baltimore Federal league club \$264,000 damages on the ground that the anti-trust laws had been violated by the use of the "reserve clause" in players' contracts.

Big Johnson, president of the American league, said "it clears the deck for a reorganization along the existing lines that will put the game on a strong foundation for the future."

"It is a triumph for the honesty of baseball," said President Dunn of the Cleveland club. "It is a wonderful victory," said President William Veck of the Cubs.
