

**GOOD RESOLVES OF NEW YEAR'S SLIP AND FALL**

People Best Behaved in January Then Get Gradually Worse—Twice as Bad in February.

February police report submitted to the city commissioners yesterday afternoon showed that something more than the expected had happened after the best behavior in January.

Year after year January records show fewer arrests than any other month. Increases in crime are, as a rule, gradual thereafter. This year there was no steady increase in the number of arrests. The February record nearly doubles that of January. Last month there were 64 arrests made and \$459.50 collected in fines. In January there were 36 arrests and \$103.40 collected in fines.

It is even evident that more of the hooch drinkers are forgetting their New Year's resolutions, and, perhaps, it is due to making of New Year's resolutions Jan. 1 that establishes January as the month of best behavior; mischief starting again just as fast as these resolutions are broken.

According to the police blotter there were 12 men who either broke or forgot their New Year's resolutions about drink. That number paid fines for drunkenness during February. Nine were arrested for drunkenness during January.

Of the major cases handled during last month there was one arrest for murder, one for assault to murder, two for robbery, eight for larceny and three for receiving stolen goods. The report follows:

State cases—assault and battery, 1; vagrancy, 7; larceny, 8; assault with a deadly weapon, 2; trespass, 1; receiving stolen goods, 3; robbery, 2; malicious mischief, 1; murder, 1; confidence game, 1; total state cases, 34.

City cases—drunkenness, 11; assault and battery, 1; disorderly conduct, 13; keeping bars open after midnight, 3; driving automobiles while drunk, 2.

Wagon calls numbered 52 and there were 143 lodgers at the station, each for one or more nights. There were 121 street lights reported out for a total number of 1,173 hours. Sixteen state cases were dismissed and three city cases. One woman was arrested and tried.

Meals furnished numbered 34. Cost of meals was \$11.90.

The report of Mrs. Anna Kirkman, police matron, follows: Calls made in the interest of the work, 97; calls received, 81; neg-

lected children looked after, 8; wayward girls looked after, 5; wayward boys looked after, 2; children taken into county court, 4; children declared dependent, 2; girls declared delinquent and sent to the

Geneva school, 2; one boy sent to Bethany home; applications for mothers' pensions, 4; applications allowed, 3; applications dismissed, 1; one woman returned to Davenport.

The report of Frank Yerbury, city plumbing inspector, follows: Water tests of plumbing, 15; final tests, 10; complaints attended, 9; old houses in which plumbing was installed, 12; new houses, 2;

sewer connections made, 2; fixtures installed, 42. Fees collected, \$44. Electrical Report. The report of William McNealy, city electrical inspector, follows: Number of permits issued, 66;

old houses in which wiring was done, 27; new houses, 1; miscellaneous buildings wired, 17; additional miscellaneous work, 9; motors installed, 13; fees collected, \$77.89.


