HYDE PARK, Mass., Oct. 25.—A rear-end collision occurred here on the New York, New Haven and Hartford railway at 5:18 p. m. in which one man was killed, a woman fatally injured and twelve other passengers, including Congressman Elijah A. Morse, were more or less seriously hurt.

COST OF ILLINOIS CHARITIES.

Amount Expended Per Capita to Take Care of the Inmates. SPRINGFIELD, Oct. 25.—The Illinois board of charities held its first quarterly meeting for 1895, and made the following report for the quarter ended Sept. 30.

THE GRAND TOTAL OF EXPENSES WAS \$272,026.67; total cost to the state, \$242,970.47; total number of inmates at the beginning of the quarter, 6,479; 764 were former inmates were admitted, and 1,031 absentees returned, making a total for the quarter of 8,438; discharged or absent, 909; died, 401.
