The Inheritance Tax.

The state supreme court has filed an opinion sustaining the inherit-ance tax law enacted by the legislature in 1895. The case came up from Cook county on an appeal from a decision of Judge Carter that the law was unconstitutional. The supreme court holds that the law applies with uniformity and that the legislature had the right to enact it. The main features of the law are that husband, wife, child, brother, sister, adopted children, and hus. band of the daughter are placed in one class, and a tax of 1 per cent is levied on every bequest to him or her, if the total value of the estate is greater than \$20,000. A different rate, to which the chief objection has been made, is applied in other cases. On estates of \$10,000 or less 3 per cent is imposed on estates of more than \$10,000 and less than \$20,000, 4 per cent; on estates amounting to over \$50,000, a tax of 5 per cent is imposed. All bequests of \$500 or less are exempt.

The Language of Crime.

The general tendency of the criminal to reduce the abstract to the concrete, to denote the substantive by one of its attributes, is shown very clearly in his synecdochical phraseology. Thus a purse is a leather; a street car is a short, comparing its length with a railroad car; a handkerchief is a wipe, and a pair of

shoes a pair of kicks.

Again, some of the terms appear to be purely arbitrary, and were it not that the creative power is absent in criminals as in women I should not hesitate to state it as a fact. But it seems wiser to conclude merely that the origin of these terms has become obscured. To suppose that they were created would be in too distinct contradiction to all obtainable evidence, indirect though it may be. Such expressions are to kip, meaning to sleep; to spiel, to make a speech; jerve, a waistcoat pocket; thimble, a watch; to do a lam, meaning to run.

Some of the expressions are very descriptive. To run from a police officer is to do a hot foot. A person who is always listening to other people's conversation is called a rubber neck. The word push, meaning a crowd, is occasionallly seen in the newspapers. To be arrested is to be pinched; to be convicted is to fall. To refuse a person's ap-peal is to give him the marble heart. Such expressions require no explanation .- A. F. B. Crofton in Popular Science Monthly.


