Exhumed Howard's Body. Chicago, March 16.—Within three or four days, it is expected, it will be known whether George Howard died from chloral poisoning or from other causes three years ago. Coroner's Physician Joseph Springer, with several other officials, went to Mount Olivet cemetery and the body was exhumed. The remains were found well preserved, and the stomach, heart and other organs were removed and turned over to Professor Haines of Rush Medical college for analysis.
