It will occur to some that it is an easy matter to do a little tall lying in making out the items of this report. Yes it is, but it is likely to avail noth-

In the branch office, say at Chicago, there is a well paid force of sleuths whose business it is to verify the items in the statement made by the merchant. If there is the least thing to the actual value of of all machinery, merchant will be asked to give a deailed list of those to whom he is inebted and the amounts of each. Then hese creditors will be written and they vill be asked to state if the figures as urned in by the merchant are correct. 'here will be a like investigation of the items that go to make up the assets of the merchant. This work of verification of statements is going on all the ime and is pushed vigorously.

There is more than a man's ledger page in determining the credit to which e is enfitled. The man's sanity, haracter, ability and habits will be inmired into. In a town like Rock Island there is a local reporter for the agency, he is always on the ground. f the merchant is doing a long turn at high rolling he can be sure this will get reported at headquarters.

Records of Courts.

Then there are the court reports and mortgage records. The local reporter sends in disclosures from them every day; that is where they effect the credit who has a rating in the agency. If merchant here files a chattel or other mortgage, or if he transfers any kind of property, a report of the transaction is sure to go to the agency the same day.
