COOL HEAD SAVES LIVES ON THE RIVER

Three Davenporters Overturned While Riding the Waves in Skiff.

Emil Kretschmer, Tony Maser and Harry Hennings, three Davenporters, were precipitated into the Mississippi by the overturning of their skiff while riding the waves of the St. Paul, which passed East Davenport about noon yesterday. When the boat overturned, Maser clung to the bottom, but Hennings was carried away and was in imminent danger of drowning. Kretschmer, who is an expert swimmer, went after the latter and brought him back to the boat and then getting an oar he got upon the bottom of the boat and paddled it to shore.

ACCIDENT CAUSES DEATH

A. H. Einfeldt, Railroad Brakeman, Expires in Davenport.

The death of A. H. Einfeldt, the brakeman who was so severely injured in the accident in the Davenport yards of the Rock Island last Wednesday, occurred Saturday evening at St. Luke's hospital, where he was removed after the accident. Mr. Einfeldt, while making a coupling, slipped and fell under the moving wheels. He was dragged about fifteen feet, and his hip and abdomen badly injured. Blood poisoning resulted. Mr. Einfeldt was single and about 35 years of age. He has a brother living in Rock Island, and the funeral will be held in this city. His old home was in Chicago.

DRINK A LUXURY

And a Dangerous Luxury, Says Volney B. Cushing

AT THE METHODIST CHURCH

Says Country Could Afford to Give Liquor Men \$1,240,000,000 Per Year—Fight Against Traffic.

"The best that can be said for an alcoholic drink is that it is a luxury, and that it is a dangerous luxury," said Volney B. Cushing, in his temperance address last evening at the First M. E. church. He said that while alcohol is useful as a medicine, it is not necessary as a beverage, and that the number of homes ruined, and the amount of money wasted on drink, qualify the statement that alcohol is a dangerous luxury. He held that the liquor business is as unnecessary as the use of alcohol is, and declared that the liquor traffic decreases the demand for the necessities of life.

Fight on Traffic.

"We could afford to give \$1,240,000,000 a year spent in liquor to the saloon men, and let them keep their commodity, and still we would be better off in the end," said the speaker. In speaking of the cure for the liquor traffic, he held that the public must array itself against it, and as earnestly against the public men who perpetuate the saloon by granting it license. He dwelt at some length on the effect of the saloon business on other legitimate business. He classified waste as one of the greatest causes of industrial depression, and pointed out that the saloon business causes a waste of over a billion dollars yearly.

He spoke at some length on the need of an earnest fight against the saloon, not only by those in the church, but by everyone interested in the right development of the nation's industries. "The reasons why good citizens should oppose the saloon are legion," said the speaker.

He was introduced by Rev. W. S. Marquis, pastor of Broadway Presbyterian church.

Rains have been general in the lower Mississippi valley, with a torrential downpour of 7.16 inches at Shreveport, and a fall of 2.46 inches at Mobile. Light rains have also fallen along the eastern Rocky mountain slope, in the Ohio valley, and in the middle Atlantic states. Generally fair weather prevails in the upper Mississippi valley.

Relatively cool weather prevails throughout the northern states east of the Rocky mountains, with moderate temperatures in southern sections. North Dakota is coolest, with a minimum of 42 degrees at Devil's lake.

An area of high pressure extends from Kansas northward to Manitoba, with the crest at Devil's lake. Areas of low pressure are located over Ontario, the Columbia basin, and southwestern Arizona.
