

TRIBUTE TO DEAD

County Bar Association Holds Memorial Exercises in the Circuit Court.

FOR LATE COL. E. J. SEARLE

Judge Hand of Supreme Court Delivers Principal Address—Suitable Resolutions Adopted.

The session of the circuit court this afternoon is being devoted to memorial exercises in honor of the late Colonel Elhauon John Searle, at one time on the bench of the supreme court of Arkansas, whose death occurred Aug. 18 at his home in this city. The court was opened at usual with Judge W. H. Gest presiding. Many of the members of the bar from nearby cities were in attendance. Judge J. P. Hand of Cambridge, of the Illinois supreme court, was the principal speaker of the afternoon, and paid a glowing tribute to the departed jurist and soldier. The court room was filled with members of the bar association and friends of the departed judge.

Adopt Resolutions. E. D. Sweeney of the committee appointed to prepare suitable resolutions made a report, touching on the life of Colonel Searle, and reporting the resolutions, which, with the second of Hon. William Jackson, were adopted.

Following the adoption of the resolutions, Judge Hand delivered the principal address of the afternoon. He was followed by M. J. McEniry, J. T. Kenworthy, and W. J. Entrikin, and other members of the bar association who paid brief tributes to Judge Searle. The exercises are to conclude with remarks by the court.
