FALLING BODIES.

Their Velocity Varies According to the

Force of Gravity.

building in New Orleans will not fall

as fast as he would if he were in New

York city. In fact, in hardly any two

places will he fall with the same

speed. This is because as we go to-

ward the equator the force of gravity

gets less and less, and consequently

the acceleration of a falling body be-

comes less, and the force of impact is

While it does not make very much

difference in the injury to a person

falling from a height, it does make a

difference in other things. Take a rifle

and fire it exactly horizontally, and if

the gun is sixteen feet above the

ground, say, at New York the bullet

fired from such a rifle will strike the

ground in exactly one second after it

leaves the rifle. If the bullet has a

horizontal velocity of 1,000 feet per

second it will strike the earth exactly

1,000 feet away. Let us take the same

rifle to a place where the force of

gravity is not the same as at New

York, but a good deal smaller, say

two-thirds smaller. We find that if

the gun is placed sixteen feet above

the ground, as before, and absolutely

horizontal the bullet will not fall the

sixteen feet in one second, but will

take over one and a half seconds to

fall, thus enabling the bullet to be in

the air during that length of time.

Therefore it will strike the ground

about 1,600 feet away. Thus it is seen

that the range of a rifle is increased


