

Easter Services and Programs in the Churches

Easter Sunday will be observed tomorrow in the churches with special programs of song and sermon, beginning with sunrise prayer services and continuing throughout the day. In the Catholic churches, at the 10:30 services masses will be sung by the full choir and soloists and in numbers of the other churches Easter cantatas will be rendered at vespers or at the hour of evening worship. Most attractive programs have been prepared, and with the weather conditions favorable, the churches should be thronged during the day. Lilies and other Easter flowers will deck the altars and proclaim the glad tidings of the risen Lord.
