HOUSEHOLD HINTS

THINGS WORTH KNOWING

To keep corks from sticking or breaking in the medicine bottles, grease the corks good with vaseline. They can be kept for years in this way and removed any time without trouble.

To prevent wooden tubs from drying out so that they leak, turn the tubs upside down after you are through using them, and pour enough water on the bottoms to cover same. You will have no trouble the next time you want to use them.

To set colors in laundering pink, green, aniline reds, lavender and purple, should be set in water containing dissolved alum, two ounces to a tub.

Drawn Butter Sauce—One-third cup of butter, three tablespoons of flour, one and one-half cups of hot water, one-half teaspoonful of salt, one-eighth teaspoonful of pepper.

Salmi Lamb—Cut cold roast lamb in thin slices. Cook five minutes two tablespoons of butter with one-half tablespoonful finely chopped onion.

White Soup—Five cups of white stock, one-half teaspoonful of salt, one-half teaspoonful of pepper, one cup of onion, one stalk of celery, two cups of scalded milk, three to spoonfuls of baking powder, one-half cup of currants.
