

**NEGROES BATTLE;
ONE LOSES LIFE**

Charles Robinson Slashed in Side Following Quarrel With Bernhard Wood.

As the result of a wild battle staged by two negroes in an alley at the rear of 704 Harrison street, Davenport, Charles Robinson died at Mercy hospital at 10:30 last night of a knife wound in his left side, and Bernhard Wood is under arrest charged with assault with intent to commit murder.

The principals in the affair had been drinking heavily and the fight was precipitated when Robinson refused to take another bottle of beer. He started to walk away, when Wood shouted, "Come back here and have another drink."

"I don't want any more," Robinson replied. Wood then became insulting, it is alleged, and his companion returned, grasping an empty beer bottle in his right hand.

Both came together, and Robinson hit his enemy twice over the head, the second blow breaking the glass. He then shoved the jagged bottle into Wood's face, inflicting a deep gash.

Wild with rage and partially blinded by the blood which was streaming down his face, Wood whipped out a pocket knife with a three-inch blade and sunk the steel into his enemy's side, just below the arm. Robinson groaned, staggered, and fell to the ground.

A hurry-up call was sent to the police, and both men were captured, the arrest being made by Detective Bishop and Officers Myer and Stafenbiel.

At police headquarters the wounded man sank into a chair and groaned, "I'm headed for the grave." He lost a considerable amount of blood and his clothing was completely saturated. Dr. Ficke was called and ordered the negro removed to the hospital.

Judge B. S. Bell Reappoints All the Old Members of Tax Equalization Body.

Adhesive Eggs of Fishes.
Among the fishes which produce adhesive eggs are the little black head minnow (*Pimephales promelas*) and the goldfish. The male blackhead deposits the fecundated eggs singly upon the under side of leaves of water plants and watches them unceasingly until hatched. The eggs of the goldfish are deposited singly upon the weeds and mosses in a similar manner by the male fish. The eggs of the yellow perch are held together in narrow strips of ribbons of a glutinous character. Adhesive eggs of other species, as the black bass, sunfish, catfishes, etc., are deposited in masses in shallow nests or depressions on the bottom, and still other species deposit their spawn in variously shaped adhesive masses upon water plants, roots and submerged objects.

Beats the Carpenter's Record.
The discovery of a carpenter whose father, grandfather and great-grandfather practiced the same craft has been commented upon in several newspapers and at Lamberhurst, in Kent, there is a family who have been innkeepers for four centuries.
