COTTON SEED OIL OLIVE OIL RIVAL

Imports of edible olive oil into the United States during the first six months under the new tariff aggregated 3,000,000 gallons, valued at \$4,000,000, or equal to the value of any year's imports down to and including 1908.

The high food value of olive oil is a subject to which attention has frequently been directed in consular reports and in bulletins of the department of agriculture, and the cultivation of the olive in California has already assumed important proportions.

There is now a wide recognition of cottonseed oil as practically equal to olive oil in food value. As a salad oil it is scarcely distinguishable from olive oil in taste and appearance, is easily assimilable by the digestive system, and is much cheaper, selling at wholesale for about 60 cents a gallon as against over \$2 a gallon for olive oil.

The United States now produces about 200,000,000 gallons of cottonseed oil per annum, imports 1,500,000 gallons, and exports considerable quantities to foreign countries.

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
