

SUGGEST PARKING PLAN FOR STREET

Highway System on Twentieth is Proposed on Hearing of Re-paring Highway.

IN TIES TO BE 45 FEET IN WIDTH

Material May Be Changed to Asphalt if New Project Talked of is Finally Decided Upon.

There is a strong probability that Rock Island's boulevard system will be extended on Twentieth street between Seventh and Eighteenth avenues. This was proposed at a public hearing held before the board of local improvements in the office of Mayor McDonough, when the report of that highway was discussed. The report of the street is brought up the second time with less opposition on the part of the property owners than under the last administration when the project was dropped after a court fight.

According to the project as proposed in the official call for the meeting, repaving with brick of the street 35 feet wide is proposed. The estimate for this work is placed at \$14,000. But at the initial session the committee, property owners looked with favor on the project of making a boulevard of the street.

Continued Until Friday.

If it is finally agreed upon, the street will be made 45 feet wide, with a 15-foot boulevard in the middle and the material will be changed to asphalt. The hearing was continued until Friday morning, when further discussion on the matter will be held before the board.

STATE PURE FOOD INSPECTORS HERE

Are Taking Samples of Milk Being Sold in the City and County To Be Analyzed.

Three members of the state pure food commission are in this city, conducting an inspection of cattle and dairy farms in Rock Island county. They spent today taking samples of all milk sold by dealers and that used in hotels and restaurants.

They arrived here last week and commenced an inspection of the dairy farms as to the sanitary conditions and followed with an inspection of the stations where milk is sold.

The samples taken are numbered, the place the milk is secured is noted, and the product taken to the laboratory at Springfield where it is tested as to the bacteria count and the amount of butter fat.

TRY MANY CASES IN POLICE COURT
