MISS DAHLGREN IS TO HEAD HOSPITAL

Chief of Lutheran Institution in Moline Comes From Englewood Hospital.

IN LATTER POST FOR 10 YEARS

Is Exceptionally Well Equipped for Work She Is to Take Up in Post Here.

Miss Amelia Dahlgren, known to many persons of Rock Island and Moline has accepted a call to be superintendent and head nurse of the Lutheran hospital of the Rock Island district, now in course of construction on the old C. A. Barnard homestead, Fifth avenue and Fifth street, Moline. Hope is that the hospital will be ready for formal opening Jan. 15 of next year and Miss Dahlgren will come to Moline at that time to take up her work.

Miss Dahlgren comes from Chicago, where she has served as superintendent and head nurse of the great Englewood hospital for 10 years. This hospital, fireproof, up-to-date in every way and equipped with 150 beds, was started in 1905. There are two nurses' homes and a modern laundry in connection.

Miss Dahlgren is exceptionally well qualified for the position which she has accepted, not only on account of her long experience in managing hospitals and training schools for nurses, but also because of thorough preparation for her life work.

AINSWORTH MUST PAY COMMISSIONS

Paulver & Kohlman, Real Estate Agents, Awarded \$980 in Moline City Court.

A verdict for the plaintiff in the suit of Paulver & Kohlman against Harry Ainsworth was returned at 8 last evening after two hours' deliberation by a jury in the Moline city court of Judge G. O. Deltz. Judgment was given against the defendant in the sum of \$980, the full amount asked by the plaintiff.

The suit was based upon a deal that was never consummated between G. A. Shallberg and Harry Ainsworth. It was proposed to trade properties, Mr. Shallberg to receive certain Canadian holdings of Mr. Ainsworth's and Mr. Ainsworth to receive certain property in the city of Moline. Paulver & Kohlman acted as agents. They were to receive \$500 in commissions from Mr. Shallberg and \$480 from Mr. Ainsworth.

According to the plaintiff, when all was ready to consummate the deal, the defendant failed to do so. This resulted in their obtaining neither commission, so they started suit to recover the whole from Mr. Ainsworth.

COURT HOUSE NEWS

Robert Eadel, member of the Industrial board of Illinois this morning conducted a hearing in the case of Paul J. Scheib, Moline, who had three fingers and a part of the palm on one hand taken off while working for Borg & Beck Machine shop, Moline. The board of arbitration awarded him \$840 to which figure the defendants took exception, and appeal to the Industrial board. Mr. Eadel intimated that he was disposed to cut the allowance to \$341.
