MEXICAN STOCK FEATURES LIST WHEAT JUMPS AT INSURANCE RISE SLACK SUPPLY IS CAUSE OF GAINS

First Hour of Wall Street Exchange Shows Great Fluctuation in Oil Shares.

New York, Dec. 30.—Mexican Petroleum was the feature of the first hour on the stock exchange today, its sales on the rise of 4 1/2 points to the new record of 112 1/2, being almost double those of steel.

New York Airbrake features the war group, advancing 4 to 141, and express company issues responded further to increased earnings.

All around improvement was shown by the stock market in today's early dealings, over night developments contributing to that condition.




