

SHOW SEATS FOR SEVEN THOUSAND

Construction of Large Amphitheatre on Rock Island Arsenal to Be Begun Next Week.

WILL FACE THE COURT OF HONOR

Three-Ring Circus Will Probably Be Presented by Young Men's Association of Locality.

With the opening of the Fort Armstrong centennial and the tri-city celebration only four weeks away, the officers of the association and the committees are bending every effort to gather up the loose ends and weave them together in order that there will be no unfinished details to cause the least possible delay to the program as arranged.

During the week a representative of the McHugh company, builders of grand stands, was in the tri-cities measuring and estimating the material to be used in the construction of the grand stand on Rock Island opposite the place where the "Court of Honor" will stand and where the illuminated pageant will pass. Work on this structure will begin within the next week and the huge amphitheatre will seat 7,000 persons when completed. The contracts for printing the tickets for the grand stand have already been awarded and the tickets will be placed on sale at various places in the three cities at least two weeks in advance of the celebration. It will be possible to reserve an entire box or section of seats for the entire week, although there will be ample seating capacity for everyone who wishes to witness these big features.

The officials of the Young Men's Christian association branches in Rock Island, Moline and Davenport are working on a possible change of the program as announced and it is possible that they will be given permission by the centennial association to proceed with their plans, according to a statement by Director-General Benson.

Circus as a Substitute.
The plans include the changing of the program of water sports, scheduled for Tuesday afternoon, and the substitution of a "three-ring circus," to be staged by the members of the Y. M. C. A. branches in each of the three cities. The circus will be staged across from the grand stand in front of the "Court of Honor," and would no doubt attract thousands of spectators.

The matter will be taken up at the executive board meeting early next week and definite arrangements made. The members of the Y. M. C. A. are enthusiastic over the plans, and, if they are allowed to proceed, declare they will have one of the principal features of the celebration. The performance as mapped out at present will occupy the entire afternoon.

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
