

COUNTY COURT IS A RAPID WORKER

Judge N. A. Larson Disposes of Four Cases in Less Than An Hour This Morning.

RAYMOND BOYS ARE RELEASED

Orders Parole of Lads Sent to St. Charles as Home Conditions Have Greatly Improved.

Four cases were disposed of in an hour in county court this morning by Judge N. A. Larson. In the case of William Butterworth and Burton P. Peek, trustees under the last will of Charles H. Deere, deceased, against John H. Lahey, assumpsit, judgment in the sum of \$500 against the defendant was entered. Dietz & Sinnott appeared for the trustees and S. E. & G. D. Long for the defendant.

In the case of Mueller Lumber company against Henry Denhardt, assumpsit, judgment in the sum of \$12,800 was entered against the defendant. Johnson & Hallsback appeared for the former and S. E. & G. D. Long for the defendant.

Orders Their Parole.

The court also granted the petition of the parents of Sam and Charles Raymond for the release of the boys on parole from St. Charles. Since the lads were taken to the school the parents have moved from a questionable neighborhood in Rock Island to Milan, and the home conditions have been so much improved that Judge Larson decided to allow the parole of the boys on condition that they go to school, to Sunday school and keep off the streets of Rock Island unless accompanied by their parents.

A new jury reported in county court this morning but was excused until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock. First case on call is that of Edward Heene against Mary Phelps, assumpsit. Suit is for \$500 on a contract for the erection of a house. The defendant claims the work was unsatisfactory. S. E. & G. D. Long appear for the contractor and Johnson & Hallsback for the defendant.

POLICE CENSURED BY LOCAL MAYOR

Rock Island Municipal Executive Charges That Night Force Shows Favoritism to Moliners.

Mayor McConochie today severely censured the police for showing favoritism to Moline prominent men in cases in which he declared arrests should have been made but in which the offenders were released.

The mayor alleges that a present Moline official was turned loose after having been arrested here in a disreputable house. He charges that an ex-official of Moline was released without trial after having been arrested for speeding. He accuses further that sons of the prominent Moline men use Rock Island as a speedway and no arrests are made.

The mayor announces that he has placed the matter directly before the police, cautioning them to show no favoritism in the future and to prosecute all persons nabbed. The city executive further states that appealed cases based on speeding will be pushed in circuit court by the city.

"Some of our valiant night force patrolmen who are rather inclined to be charitable to Moline high-toned offenders let one of the present Moline commissioners go when caught red-handed in a disreputable house in Rock Island, and a sporty high-flyer, an ex-official of Moline, was released for speeding. It is not the intention of this administration to shield these high-toned offenders. I am in favor of fining them and publishing their names. I don't believe in being any more generous to them than to any one else. I have instructed the police to take care of the matter in the future and show no favoritism.

"Another thing which has to be stopped in Rock Island and that is letting some of the high-toned speeders off. Rich men's sons in Moline use Rock Island as a speedway and if they fail to get out of the matter with no fine they appeal the cases. "Automobile speeders are going to be prosecuted to the limit. They can appeal the cases but they might as well understand now as any other time that it is going to cost them something. We are going all the way with these cases if it takes a year. We will fight them in circuit court if they want to stand the expense. It won't cost the city as much as it will them. Heretofore appealed cases have been dropped but they will be pushed in the future. We can bide our time until they come up."






