

## Y. CIRCUS A BIG DRAWING CARD

"Enthusiasm" Is Keynote of Show as Introduced by "Billy" McIntyre Last Night.

### STUNTS ARE CORKERS HE SAYS

Senior and Junior Boys Display Work That Shows Training of M. A. Clevett.

With W. B. "Billy" McIntyre as ringmaster, the big annual circus of the Y. M. C. A. was presented last night in the gymnasium for the first of two performances.

Six hundred people roared with laughter as Mr. McIntyre on his white steed led the circus procession around the sawdust ring. The old country gentleman who helped each spectator to his seat was no other than Rev. David A. Johnson.

The six clowns that paraded the arena were the "old gang" that appears annually at the Y circuses and keeps the audience going. There was one figure missing last night, a lad who is known for his wit and clean comedy. Honoring this comedian, "Rosie" Irving Wright and others now serving the

United States army over there, the crowd sang "Keep the Home Fires Burning."

To M. A. Clevett, physical director of the Y. M. C. A. goes the credit for the able manner in which the boys, both juniors and seniors, were trained. One of the hits of the evening was the boxing match between Bulldog Flee vs. Knut Glos-worm, who were to go 60 rounds, but gave up at the fourth when both the onlookers and participants were ousted by an officer.

Ike and Mike, the famous instantaneous photo-grafers, successfully took pictures of several people in the audience and produced the pictures in less than one minute after the bulb was squeezed.

The senior boys drew much applause with their chair acrobatics, gymnastic stunts on horses and twin bars, their steel wands and as elephant leapers. Boy Scouts of Eagle Patrol, troop 1, demonstrated excellently how expeditiously a tent can be pitched and taken down. They bandaged the foot of one scout after he had fallen over one of the tent ropes and fixed up another who bruised his head, also by a fall.

### Holdup a Scram.

A real western holdup, including the real Indians, bandits and the American cowboys, made another score. This act was given by boys between the ages of 9 and 12 years. Several bandits held up a stage coach, and after taking one man's wrist-watch, the false teeth from

another and a young lady's tooth-brush, spent the night in the wilds. Finally a fierce bunch of Indians approach, take the booty and chase the bandits. Here the Indians make their home and when sound asleep are attacked by the cow-boys. They all settle and the scene closes as the Indians try to escape and are followed by the boys.

Dumbbell drills by the juniors, athletic dances by older employed boys, junior employed boys in the stupendous speed tournament and the twisting and twirling by the seniors were all acts showing the work of the Y. M. C. A. Dubinsky and the dummy, and Shimmie the Sharpshooter, who also led an amazing array of trained "animals" across the stage were "cork-ers," as Mr. McIntyre said.

The entire circus was one of good work and was well received by the audience. The show will be repeated this evening and the same program will be given.
