

### YOUTHS FIRED BY MOVIES TO STEAL HORSE

One of the Pair Also Departs From Home With His Mother's Diamond Ring, She Says.

Fired by the deeds portrayed on the movie screen, Lyman Ballard, 15, and Fred Lupe, 13, Chicago boys, are headed west behind a stolen horse and buggy, the property of Robert McConnell of Milan.

Authorities of Iowa towns have been notified to be on the lookout for the two youths. Not only are they wanted for the theft of the animal, but also for stealing a diamond ring, owned by Mrs. Ballard.

The pair appeared at the McConnell home Tuesday afternoon. Young Ballard formerly lived in Milan with his parents, who were tenants of the McConnells. They explained they were visiting some people in Rock Island and the story was believed. Casually, Lyman inquired of Mr. McConnell if his horse drove single or double. Late that night they succeeded in making off with the means of conveyance.

"Too Much Movies," explained the mother. A telegram was received by the Milan authorities yesterday afternoon from Mrs. Ballard in response to the notification of the theft. The message stated Lyman had stolen the mother's diamond ring.

The welcome home program for the soldiers began in the afternoon and continued through the evening. In the afternoon there were addresses by Rev. F. J. Roif and Rev. C. P. O'Neill of this city, instrumental music by the Aledo band and singing by an Aledo quartet and a chorus of 20 young women from Reynolds. A ball game between Edgington and Buffalo Prairie, won by the latter, was played.

band. This was followed by a dance which, by the way, was given by the young people of the community and was not under the auspices of the Red Cross.


