SEARLE MAKES STATEMENT ON ELECTION VOTE

Charles J. Searle, defeated independent candidate for delegate to the state constitutional convention, issued the following statement to the public today:

"There is very little a defeated candidate can say that won't sound like the complaint of a hard loser. I don't want to seem that I have been in too many battles in my life not to know how to take defeat. So far as I am personally concerned, I am better off as a loser than as a winner. I did have hopes that the cause I was fighting for might have won. I have been fighting a good while along the same line, and am still firm in the belief that changes in our constitution and laws such as I advocated will ultimately have to prevail. I regretted I had to encounter so many cross currents in my fight. I was trying to swim straight across the river without regard to such cross currents. I seem to be so constituted that I would not take any pleasure in swimming the river unless I could swim it straight across from dock to dock. I also suffered the disadvantage of having, and freely expressing, positive convictions to all classes and in all parts of the district alike, which doesn't seem to be good political form. I also had the handicap of the active opposition of our four local city administrations. But as I read the returns, the wet and dry issue seems to have been the decisive factor in my defeat. While this, of course, must be recognized as an important issue, it seems to me unfortunate that this question should eternally override all other issues. In my judgment, we have much more important issues to solve in this country than the one of whether we shall drink 3 1/2 per cent or 2 1/2 per cent beer. I conducted my campaign clean and above board and have nothing to either regret or apologize for.

"I am profoundly grateful to my friends for the voluntary assistance they rendered me, and thank them and the good people who believe in the principles I advocated, for their support. I want to say that I am not at all discouraged at the outcome and will be found in the next campaign in some capacity, it matters not what, on the side of good and just government in the interests of the masses. As I have said before, good government doesn't just grow 'like Topsy'; it has to be constantly fought for, and every inch of the way."


