

SPECIAL MEET TO DECIDE ON RUSSIA'S FATE

George Hints Powers Must Do Something to Curb Ambitions of Germany.

London, Nov. 12.—Premier Lloyd George declared in the house of commons today that no person at home, on his behalf, or with knowledge, had interviewed any representatives in order to learn whether negotiations for peace might be opened and upon what terms.

The premier announced that it was proposed to call at an early date an international conference at which the ministers of the allied and associated powers might consider the various problems which peace conference as yet had not been able to settle, among which was the problem of Russia.

London, Nov. 12.—The settlement of the Russian problem, said the premier, was most essential to the construction of the world. The conditions in that country, he declared, were a contributing cause of the prevailing high prices. Likewise, he said, the German reparations were already using the present strife in Russia to strengthen their influence.

Washington, Nov. 13.—There is to be no compromise with the bolshevik government in Russia by the United States it was learned today at the state department. Official said there had been no exchange of notes between this government and the British or any other government concerning suggestions that a conference with the bolsheviks be undertaken.

This country's attitude in the same now, it was said, as it was last year when Secretary Lansing appealed to the civilized nations of the world to declare the bolshevik outlaws.

MOST DECORATED SOLDIER COMES TO ROCK ISLAND

The most decorated soldier in the United States, possessor of the congressional medal, two croix de guerre and three other decorations, Private Clayton K. Slack, only 23, and known as "Wisconsin's greatest hero," is a guest in Rock Island. He is here to pass a week in the city with two companions, Lieutenant Earl H. Leamp, and Corporal Berger Lowman, all of whom are representing the interests of American Heroes, a publication for and by ex-service men. Mr. Slack received his congressional medal, the highest acknowledgment of bravery that can be conferred by the United States, direct from the hands of General Pershing at Chaumont in recognition of "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action, above and beyond the call of duty." He is the only Wisconsin man to have received the medal, of which the government has conferred only 74. He wears also the legion of honor medal militaire, presented by Marshal Pétain at Brest, a croix de guerre with palms in recognition of bravery in rescuing a companion under a heavy barrage, a second one in recognition of the congressional medal, and a decoration from the king of Montenegro. He has been notified that he will be awarded the Victorian cross from England, and a Belgian and an Italian medal.
