

**PIONEER DAYS  
RECALLED WITH  
AMATEUR FARCE**

Cast of Girls Present Olden Time Play of Jollity Before Crowd at Community Club.

One of the cleverest little amateur theatrical productions seen here in a long while was "Pioneer Days," an original farce presented by the community service league in the community club last night. A feature of the performance was that no men took part in the entire production. The visit of two Indians to the home and their bartering with the pioneers comprised the action of scene one.

All Players Good.

The meetin' house, scene two, was equally good. All who took part in it deserve praise, for without exception the parts were happily bestowed and were carried out true to life. A marriage ceremony in burlesque was the big feature, while the sermon was also interesting. However, in point of laughability, the last scene, and longest, the pioneer school, was the big hit. A bevy of harum-scarum kiddies romped through the scene and gave a great portrayal of the country school of old times. Occasionally the thrill giggle of "Samantha Pi..." accentuated the mirth. **MILK TESTS LOW  
GRADE AND FINE  
OF \$10 IS IMPOSED**

C. F. Berg, milk dealer, was fined \$10 by Magistrate D. J. Cleland in Rock Island police court this morning on a charge of selling milk containing less than 3 per cent butter fat.

Henry H. Harris, city health officer, made the complaint. The standard percentage of butter fat in milk is 3 per cent. The milk sold by Berg tested only 2.4 per cent when a sample was taken, the city health officer testified.

The city health officer warned Berg to sell no more milk in Rock Island that is not up to the standard. He also said that any dealer found selling milk or cream below the standard will be arrested and fined.
