Let Us Have a Union Depot—Business Warrants It—Railroad Intelligence.

A subject that has from time to time agitated the minds of the more progressive and enterprising citizens of Rock Island, is again being discussed, and if the ideas of these gentlemen favoring the project are met by a sufficient amount of public interest, the time is not far distant when such an institution will be constructed in Rock Island.

Rock Island is a terminal point of important divisions of two of the great trunk lines of the west. It is the terminus of the Racine & Southwestern division of the C. M. & St. P. and the Rock Island & St. Louis, and virtually of the C. B. & N. divisions of the C. B. & Q. Besides being an important point on the main line of the great road, which bears its name—the C. R. I. & P. or as it is commonly called—"The Great Rock Island Route."

All of these roads have their lines very close to each other, in a part of the city most suitable for a grand-union depot between the river and Second avenue, and from Twentieth street east to the bridge.
