WHIG RATIFICATION MEETING. A meeting of the Whigs of Warsaw, was held at the Court House on Wednesday evening, June 14, 1848 for the purpose of responding to the nominations of the Whig National Convention for President and Vice President.

On motion of Felix Hunton, Esq., Doct. Jas. H. Benson was called to the Chair, and N. M. Sterrett appointed Secretary. On motion of Chas. N. Handy, Esq. the meeting was opened with three cheers for Gen. Taylor.

On motion the Chair appointed the following gentlemen a Committee to draft resolutions expressive of the sense of the meeting: When upon, H. H. White, Jas. Winston, Felix Hunton, J. R. Pointer, and Chas. N. Handy were appointed.

Resolved, That the Whigs of Benton county Missouri, hail the nomination of Gen. Z. Taylor, for President, and Millard Fillmore, for Vice President, as a sure precursor of the most triumphant success of the Whig party in the United States.

Resolved, That the political opinions of Gen. Taylor as contained and expressed in his letter of April 22d, 1848, addressed to Capt. J. S. Allison, meet with our fullest and most cordial approbation.

Resolved, That we regard Millard Fillmore as a worthy compatriot of Gen. Taylor in the Whig ranks, that we consider him as a patriot and Statesman.

Resolved, That the Whigs of Benton county go hand in hand for Rough and Ready, the American General, the hero of the Mexican war, the patriot of the land, who never surrendered to any foe.

Resolved, That with the aid and assistance of our worthy fellow citizen James Winston, we will give John S. Phelps some trouble in his election.

LATER FROM MEXICO.

The U. S. steamship Virginia arrived this morning from Vera Cruz, which place she left on the 26th ult. At her time of sailing, no intelligence had been received of the action of the Mexican Senate on the treaty.

The Virginia passed the schooner Flirt 10 miles N. E. of the castle, bound in; and on the 29th ult. in lat. 24 N. long. 93 W. saw the U. S. transport ship American, bound south.
