NOTICE TO HOMESTEADERS

United States Land Office,
Santa Fe, New Mexico,
December 12, 1910.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of the Interior, by recent decision revoked the decision in the case of Esberne K. Muller, 39 L. D. 72, relative to leave of absence in connection with commutation proof, and that the practice in regard to leaves of absence is now the same as before the Muller decision, that is, that a leave of absence will not break the continuity of residence if the entryman returns to his land and re-establishes his residence before the expiration of leave of absence.
