Washington, D. C., Sept 6.—Preparations for advancing upwards of a billion dollars in Agricultural and livestock credits under recent legislation have virtually been completed by the war finance corporation, officials said. The corporation probably will be ready within a week or so to function under its enlarged powers designed to afford needed credit relief to the farmers, it was said.

To expedite the advances executive committees are being formed in agricultural and stock raising sections and will attend to preliminary details of applications, making the necessary investigations and determining the adequacy of securities offered.
