WILLIS A. DORSETT KILLED

For Several Years He Worked at the Bell Ranch.

News has been received in Tucumcari of the death of Willis A. Dorsett an old-time cowman of the Bell Ranch.

Mr. Dorsett was found December 8 lying on the road close to the street pavement near Compton, California. Presumably he was knocked down by a truck. He was on his way home. Mr. Dorsett was so seriously injured that he died two days later, December 8 in a hospital.

The news of his death was a shock to his many former friends who live in this part of the country.

Mr. Dorsett was born at Ft. Bliss, Texas in 1859. The family moved to Ft. Sumner in 1862, later moving to Ft. Bascom on the Red River, where they lived for many years. Later, the family moved to La Cinta Canyon.

He was employed at the Bell Ranch during the management of Mike Slattery and also during the time of A. J. Tisdale and Mr. O'Donnell. He moved to California in 1912.

He is survived by a wife, three daughters and a son, several brothers and sisters, and two grandsons.
