#### A New Way to Keep Eggs.

Cincinnati, Sept. 17.—George Vonderahe of D. Hoppe & Co. is enthusiastic over the discovery of Dr. Alfred Springer. Mr. Springer has experimented for a long time in preserving eggs. Dr. Springer recently attended a meeting of the British Ass'n for the Advancement of Science in Canada, where his discovery was explained. Mr. Springer's experiments show that an egg can be kept eight weeks without spoiling if immersed in pure water. His experiments include perfectly keeping eggs 56 days in distilled water. Water prevents the germ which ordinarily infects eggs and causes decay. Mr. Springer got the idea from ducks, which adopt the plan naturally.

#### Shot Her Own Sister.

Pensacola, Sept. 17.—Suffering from a wound in the abdomen, Miss Elva McClammy, a young lady residing north of the city, was brought to the city at a late hour last night and placed in a sanitarium, where an operation was immediately performed in the hope of saving her life. She was shot late last night by her younger sister, who did not know a revolver, which she playfully snapped, was loaded. The weapon was found by the girl in her father's room and she snapped it twice, not realizing that some of the chambers were loaded.
