Plans are now being drawn by Cairns & Fitchener for a two-story and basement concrete building to be erected on the Codrington lot, corner Boulevard and Rich avenue. The building will front on the Boulevard 75 feet and on Rich avenue 34 1/2 feet. There will be three stories on the first floor; the room in the second floor over the corner store will be connected with the store below by a wide interior stair case, so that the person who uses the corner store can also use the room overhead, which will be well lighted.
