The importance of gasoline in the
conduct of the war is more and more
visible in Washington every day.
When the allies began their offen-
sive on the western front it was on a
comparatively short line, but this has
increased and is now three or four
times greater than when the drive be-
gan five weeks ago.
The trucks that this country has
sent over by the thousands upon
thousands are taking the place of rail
roads, which the Germans are destroy-
ing on their retreat. The allies do
not take time to rebuild the railroads.
They don't have to. But it takes gaso-
line to do all this.

The man who saves gasoline on Sun-
day is helping to furnish the power to
keep up the western offensive.

The government is not making pub-
lic its gasoline requirements in the
war, but it is known that they have
increased tremendously in the past
three or four weeks.

SPANISH INFLUENZA PREYS ON SOLDIERS

An Atlantic Port, Sept. 22.—Early
500 American soldiers suffering from
Spanish influenza were taken to
port today and taken to hospital for
treatment.

The severe cases were taken to one
of the military hospitals here while
the other sufferers were quarantined in
several large halls commandeered by
the military authorities and fitted up
for the emergency. The men will re-
main under strict quarantine for sev-
eral weeks.

Boston, Sept. 22.—Forty-four
deaths from influenza and 19 from
pneumonia were reported by the
board of health today, the second lar-
gest total of any day since the epidem-
ic commenced here. Several schools
will be closed tomorrow.

The Carney and Boston city hospi-
tals announced today they were
crowded that they could accept no
more influenza patients.

Naval authorities said tonight that
the disease had diminished in the first
naval district.

Newport, R. I., Sept. 22.—A marked
improvement in the influenza situa-
tion was noted today in the second na-
val district. Only 45 new cases and
five deaths were recorded. Several
of the naval bases are still free of the
disease.

AMERICANS HAVE TAKEN 100 HUN PRISONERS

Washington, Sept. 22.—German
prisoners taken by the Americans,
French and English since July 18 now
amount approximately 20,000, accord-
ing to a French adviser.

The cable quotes French war cor-
respondents to the effect that the Ger-
man prisoners have fallen into ene-
my hands at the rate of about 100,000 a
month, and that German losses in kill-
ed and wounded have been heavier
than has been generally estimated.
