

**Imperial Cemetery Association**

IMPERIAL, Cal., April 2, 1903.  
Minutes of the first meeting of the Board of Directors of the Imperial Cemetery Association:

Called to order at 11 o'clock a. m.  
Present: Directors T. P. Banta, F. C. Paulin and H. C. Oakley; absent, directors A. H. Heber and J. W. Oakley.  
On motion of F. C. Paulin, seconded by H. C. Oakley, T. P. Banta was elected temporary chairman.

On motion of T. P. Banta, seconded by F. C. Paulin, H. C. Oakley was elected temporary secretary.

The meeting being called to order by the chairman, the organization of the board was proceeded with.

Moved by F. C. Paulin, seconded by H. C. Oakley that H. C. Heber be elected president; carried.

Moved by F. C. Paulin, seconded by H. C. Oakley that T. P. Banta be elected vice president; carried.

Moved by H. C. Oakley, seconded by F. C. Paulin that R. D. McPherrin be elected secretary; carried.

Moved by F. C. Paulin, seconded by T. P. Banta, that H. C. Oakley be elected treasurer; carried.

Moved by F. C. Paulin, seconded by H. C. Oakley, that the secretary be instructed to immediately collect all the outstanding subscriptions and issue certificates of stock and receipts for lots; carried.

On motion, the secretary was allowed the sum of \$10 as salary for the first six months.

Moved by F. C. Paulin, seconded by H. C. Oakley, that the proper officer be instructed to secure from Mr. A. H. Heber an agreement to convey to the association the south one-half of the southeast one quarter of section 5, 15-14, when the same has been proved up by him, the association to pay the \$1 per acre and any costs incurred by such proof; carried.

On motion, the secretary was instructed to complete the purchase of the 20 shares of stock heretofore arranged for at the rate of \$15 per share, including the filing fee already paid on the 80 acres of land, same to be paid as soon as there are sufficient funds to do so; carried.

Whereas a partially completed plat covering about twenty acres of the above described land has been presented by L. C. Vickrey, it is moved and seconded that the said plat when completed be accepted, and the secretary is authorized to settle with Mr. Vickrey for services rendered and for cost of staking out the lots in accordance with said plat; carried.

Moved that Mr. F. H. Wales be elected grave digger, charge for same not to exceed \$3 for each interment; carried.

The secretary is authorized to collect all moneys coming to the association and deposit same in the First National Bank of Imperial. Funds belonging to said association shall be drawn from said bank by check signed either by the president or vice president and countersigned by the secretary; carried.

On motion, F. C. Paulin was appointed a committee of one to draft a set of by-laws and submit the same to the next meeting of the board of directors; carried.

Whereas the resignation of J. W. Oakley as director of this association has been received, moved and seconded that the same be accepted, and that R. D. McPherrin be elected a director, in place of J. W. Oakley, resigned; carried.  
On motion the meeting adjourned.


