

PLANT FOR FUEL

One of the Greatest Needs of the Valley is Trees

One of the greatest needs of the valley now is trees. They are needed for shade, for fence posts and for fuel, and the person who plants trees in abundance ought to make large money in a few years. It ought to be possible for every farmer to get in several hundred red gum or other eucalyptus trees this winter, and no one ought to neglect to do so. So far there has been fuel obtainable from the natural growth of the desert, but the supply is disappearing rapidly, and unless haste is made to grow a new supply it will be an added expense to import fuel.

For quick foliage and fence posts, cottonwood serves, but it is not adapted to fuel, and herein lies one of our greatest needs.
