REPUBLICAN CAUCUS

**Wilsie Endorsed for Supervisor—
Farnsworth for State Convention**

The Republicans turned out in full force at the caucus Tuesday evening, and a good campaign start was made.

The meeting was called to order by County Committeeman L. F. Farnsworth, when H. E. Allatt was made chairman and R. D. McPherrin, Esq., secretary.

R. D. McPherrin, Esq., was elected delegate to the County Convention from Imperial City, and it being suggested that the municipality might also be allowed a second delegate, G. E. Irwin was elected to that position.

For Imperial "outside," or that portion of the precinct outside the city limits, Mr. Farnsworth was chosen.

On motion, either of the delegates not attending was authorized to issue a proxy.

It was resolved as the sense of the meeting that it considered the securing of a supervisor for the Valley as of first importance, and delegates will accordingly work first of all to that end, and secondarily for such other recognition as they may be able to secure.

On motion, Mr. W. E. Wilsie, of Silsbee, was declared the choice of the meeting for supervisor, H. N. Dyke, Esq., of this city, for county committeeman, and L. F. Farnsworth, of Imperial "outside" for delegate to the State convention.

At Brawley, F. H. Stanley has been chosen delegate, and at Silsbee W. M. Cole.
