 TO THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF IMPERIAL WATER COMPANY NUMBER ONE

We the undersigned stockholders in your company call your attention to the following:

Parties named Vanden Heuvel and Fuller, living on the Elm and Elder ditches, are allowing their cows and cattle, numbering over 130 head, to stand in the company's ditches and soil the water and we who are living below them are entirely dependent upon the water of the ditches for household uses and domestic purposes and are therefore compelled to use this soiled, filthy and unhealthy water, thereby endangering the lives and health of our wives, children and ourselves.

We would therefore petition and pray that your honorable body immediately take such action as will stop such acts, not only by the parties named but by all of the parties who may hereafter use the company's ditches.

Cattle standing in the ditches are not only a menace to our lives in compelling us to use polluted water, but they are also destroying the company's property by tramping down the ditch banks and filling the ditch with mud and filth.

The parties named have had neighborly warning but we desire that you put a stop to the practice.
