

LATEST FROM INTAKE

Increased Flow of River a Benefit.

Rockwood Gate a Success and Work Progressing Favorably

During the past week there was a sharp rise in the Colorado river and coming as it did just when the work of filling in the intake was in progress some apprehension was felt that damage to the works might result. This fear, however, was unfounded and the increased flow of water was turned to good advantage in washing out the pass through the Rockwood gate.

On last Thursday, just as the water was at its highest, Rev. W. G. Conley, of Redlands, visited the heading. He saw the work of blasting to facilitate the enlargement of the by pass that was being done under the personal supervision of Mr. Cory and says it was a great success, as about half of the river's flow of 15,000 second feet was passing through the Rockwood gate and that channel was being enlarged every minute. He also visited the old channel and estimated that a raise of one foot more would start the water flowing down that way to the Gulf. At the concrete gate he found the work of opening the Inlet from the river nearly completed and was assured by Mr. D. L. Russell, who has charge of that work that it would be completed in a few days. In all probability the water in the river will subside in a day or two, when the concrete gate being ready for use a large proportion of it can be turned through it and the rest will pass through the Rockwood gate. This will leave the completion of the Hind dam free to go on unmolested. Meantime the flow through the concrete gate will be cutting the canal for bringing water to this Valley larger and thereby removing all danger of a water shortage. The increased flow of the river during the past week has been so handled that it has measurably lessened the time when the Mexican intake will be closed and the water under control will be taken out at the concrete gate.
