CLASS IN EL CENTRO

Miss M. L. Wiley, Supt. of W. C. T. U. Meets Here

The medal contest department of the W. C. T. U. seeks to present temperance truths and facts in an attractive guise.

Little people and older young people, matrons, silver grays and old people, as the case may be, memorize and receive training on interesting temperance selections.

Then a public contest is held; competent and impartial judges are secured who mark the contestants on five points: Voice, articulation, memory, gesture and general effect. The silver medal is the first one awarded. Those holding silver medals may contest for a gold. Those holding a gold may contest for the grand gold, etc. The next medal is a gold with one diamond worth twenty-five dollars. The last and highest is a fifty dollar diamond medal. There are also several special medals—the L. T. L., the S. S. Franchise, etc. The young people who enter contest classes are benefited by the training they receive, by the sentiments which become a part of their being and by acquiring the ability to express their thoughts clearly in the presence of an audience. Obtaining the medal is an inducement but the personal improvement and the gift of molding public sentiment is of greater value.

Miss M. L. Wiley, the State Supt. of medal contests of Southern California W. C. T. U. has come into Imperial Valley and has organized three classes in Brawley. She hopes to organize at least two classes in each town in the valley. Mrs. P. O. Parsons of El Centro, who is superintendent of medal contests for our new county has already organized a class in El Centro which will be heard the latter part of November. Miss Wiley hopes to organize a class among the little people who will be heard later on. Competent trainers will be secured for each class and the work will be carried forward under the direction of Mrs. P. O. Parsons of El Centro.
