

BULL FIGHT AT MEXICALI

Border Town Will Open Its Plaza de Toros on Fifth of May.

Mexicali is making progress toward the goal of her citizens' ambition, and that is the position of first importance among the towns of Baja California. Mexicali hopes to be the capital of the district, and to fit herself for that exalted honor she has acquired a bull ring or "Plaza de Toros."

On the fifth of May—"Cinco de Mayo"—the first bull fight will be pulled off under the management of Rubio, the Spanish bull fighter who learned his business in old Spain, managed the Plaza de Toros in the City of Mexico and more recently conducted similar exhibitions at Tia Juana. Rubio has obtained twelve wild bulls from the ranch of Gen. Terrazos in Chihuahua, and they are said to be of fighting breed. Because of the objections of Americans to the revolting slaughter of blind-folded horses, no horses or picadors will be in the ring.

The matador, or chief bull fighter, who kills the bull with a sword, is Francisco Alonzo Paquiro, of Madrid. He will be assisted by five agile "banderilleros."

Details of the affair may be found in the advertising columns. The arena is said to have cost \$5000 and to be a better structure than the one at Tia Juana.

ERRONEOUS SURVEY

Discrepancy of Three Miles Troubles Claimants in East Townships

Desert land claimants in the extreme eastern part of the Imperial Valley find themselves in an embarrassing predicament as the result of the resurvey. The land in question is all out of reach of the present canal system.

All land lying east of the center of Range 16 east, has been for several years withdrawn from entry under the Laguna Dam project of the Reclamation Service, and is subject only to homestead entry under the provisions of that act. Numerous desert land entries have been made on the west side of the center of range 16, according to prevailing surveys. On the issuance of the plats of the resurvey it is found that the center of range 16 has been moved west about three miles and that the desert land claimants find themselves platted on the east half of the range, and therefore under the ban of the Reclamation Service.

Attorney Dunlap, of Los Angeles, is representing a number of the entrymen. He took the matter of adjustment up with the officials of the Reclamation Service, but they informed him that the land had been officially withdrawn and that entries made thereon could have no recognition.

Failing here Mr. Dunlap presented the case to the officials of the U. S. Land Office at Los Angeles, and they agreed to support action for relief.

The case will now be taken to the Secretary of the Interior for adjudication.—Brawley News.

RESOLUTION NO. 2.

Resolved:—That it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of El Centro to cause to be planted with shade trees portions of certain streets in the City of El Centro hereinafter mentioned under the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California relating to the planting and maintenance and care of shade trees within municipalities approved March 11, 1893.

Said streets are as follows:
Heil avenue from East line of 6th street to west line of 5th street.

Brighton avenue from the East line of Eighth street to the Inter-California Railway Co. right of way.

Olive street from the East line of Eighth street to the Inter-California Railway Co. right of way.

State street from the East line of Eighth street to the West line of Sixth street.

Broadway from the East line of Eighth street to the West line of Sixth street.

Commercial street from the East line of Eighth street to the West line of Fourth street.

Holt avenue from the East line of Eighth street to the Inter-California Railway Co. right of way.

The trees planted on said streets shall be pepper trees between one and two years of age and at least twelve inches high and shall be planted thirty feet apart.

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this resolution and shall cause the same to be published once in the Imperial Valley Press, a newspaper published and circulated in the City of El Centro.
