FARMERS' UNION MEETING

Directors Instructed to Take Steps Toward Incorporation of County Body

A very enthusiastic meeting of the county delegates of the Imperial Valley Farmers' Union was held at Brawley last Saturday.

Mr. D. W. Tyler gave an interesting report of his observations in Fresno, and reported that the work of the Farmers' Union at that place is proving very successful, and results are being obtained by degrees which are proving advantageous to the farmer.

It was unanimously agreed that the County Union incorporate, and the Board of Directors and the president and secretary and treasurer were instructed to prepare incorporation papers at once.

Practically a full delegation was in attendance at this meeting, and from the reports given it is estimated that the county membership now reaches the 400 mark.

Secretary McKinney says that the meeting at Brawley really resulted in a better understanding of local conditions than has attained at any previous meeting, and he is firmly of the belief that the Union will prove a great benefit to the farmers, providing they stand together for their rights.

ARABIAN ALFALFA SEED

Probably Ten Tons Will be Available For Distribution in Imperial Valley This Fall.

J. M. Westgate, agronomist of the Bureau of Plant Industry, Department of Agriculture, has written to Fritz Kloeke, at Calexico, that he has received word from the government's agent in Arabia that twenty tons of Arabian alfalfa seed will be shipped to the bureau by boat which will reach New York not later than December 10, Mr. Westgate says the bureau has already received orders for several tons of this seed for use in Imperial Valley, and that fully ten tons will be available for distribution here if the shipment comes as represented.

This distribution will be made through Mr. Kloeke. The advantage of the Arabian alfalfa is that it will give at least one and probably two more cuttings a year than the crops grown at present.
