

### WILL BUILD JURY ROOM

County Supervisors Ask For Bids For This Improvement—Bodies May Be Removed From Brawley Cemetery.

The Board of Supervisors of Imperial County met at the Court House in El Centro at 9 o'clock a. m., on March 14, 1910, being called to order by Chairman McHarg.

Supervisors present: McHarg, Ferguson, Wade, Clark. Supervisor absent: Webster.

The minutes of the meeting of March 8 were read and approved as corrected.

The Board ordered that the bridge crew now working on the Slisbee bridge be instructed to remain at work on said bridge until the carpenter work is completed.

The Board ordered that the Clerk advertise for bids for the construction of a jury room over the County Jail, said bids to be opened and considered April 5.

On motion passed by the Board, permission is given to interested parties to remove any bodies buried more than one year in the Brawley cemetery, providing permission is secured from the County Health Officer and the State Board of Health.

The Board accepted for the benefit of the public dedication of streets and alleys of the Crawford subdivision No. 1, according to a plat on file.

The Board adjourned to the time of the next regular meeting.

### DESERT ENTRY MEN WIN

W. A. Van Horn this week received from Powers & Holland, his attorneys in Los Angeles, news that the United States Supreme Court has affirmed the judgment of the lower court in the case entitled Pauly vs. Broadnax, et al. This is a case wherein Pauly claimed as a school section land held by W. T. Broadnax, W. A. Van Horn, Fred Fuller, V. K. Brooks and W. J. Mossholder. At the first trial in the San Diego Superior Court, before Imperial County was created, the jury disagreed, and the second trial in this court resulted in a verdict for the desert entrymen. The matter was carried to the highest court, and has been dragging along for more than three years.

### WANTS PAINTED INDIANS

San Bernardino is to celebrate its centennial in May with a three-days' fiesta. One of the features is to be an Indian village and programme of Indian sports. N. Davenport, of Colton, has been placed in charge of this section, and is endeavoring to get a bunch of the painted Cocopahs from Imperial Valley and Yumas from the Indian Reservation, in the Colorado River District in Imperial County, to participate in this celebration.

### GOES TO ARCADE STATION

Alfred Wiley, who has been ticket agent for the Southern Pacific and Holtgen Interurban at El Centro for the past few months, and who at various times previously has served the railroads in several positions here, has been appointed assistant ticket agent at the Arcade Station, Los Angeles, and will leave next week to assume his new duties.

### COURT HOUSE IMPROVEMENTS

During the past week the woodwork on the Court House frontage has received a new dress of paint. The color used is dark gray. The steam heating plant has been installed, and an awning has been placed along the east frontage of the County Jail.

### SPECIAL SCHOOL ELECTION

Alamitos school district will have a special election on April 9 to vote on a proposition to issue \$500 bonds for the improvement of school grounds and liquidating indebtedness already incurred for such purpose.
