Office of the Board of Supervisors, Imperial County, California.

El Centro, August 18, 1910.

Board called to order by Supervisor Clark and chairman Pro tem, at 10 a. m.

Supervisors present: Clark, Webster, Ferguson.

Supervisors absent: McHarg, Wade.

Minutes of meeting of Aug. 2nd read and approved.

This being the time fixed by law for the canvassing of the returns of the Primary election held Aug. 16th, and it appeared that all the returns of said election are now at hand, it is on motion, made and passed, ordered the canvassing of said returns be taken up and proceeded with, and it is found upon checking and canvassing the said returns that on the Republican Ticket for Governor, Alden Anderson received 115 votes, Charles Forrest Curry received 93 votes, Nathaniel Ellery received 12 votes, Hiram W. Johnson received 336 votes, Phillip A. Stanton received 167 votes, Theodore Bell received one vote.

For Lieutenant Governor, Robert L. Farner received 168 votes, Richard Ferris received 170 votes, Francis B. Keesling received 55 votes, Albert J. Wallace received 206 votes.
