If anything, too much rain has fallen. During a stay of six weeks at his farm, there were only two days during which the skies were unclouded and the sun shone brightly. Mr. Stortz calculates that he will have 175,000 pounds of home-grown potatoes on his place for market this fall, all being raised without irrigation, too.
